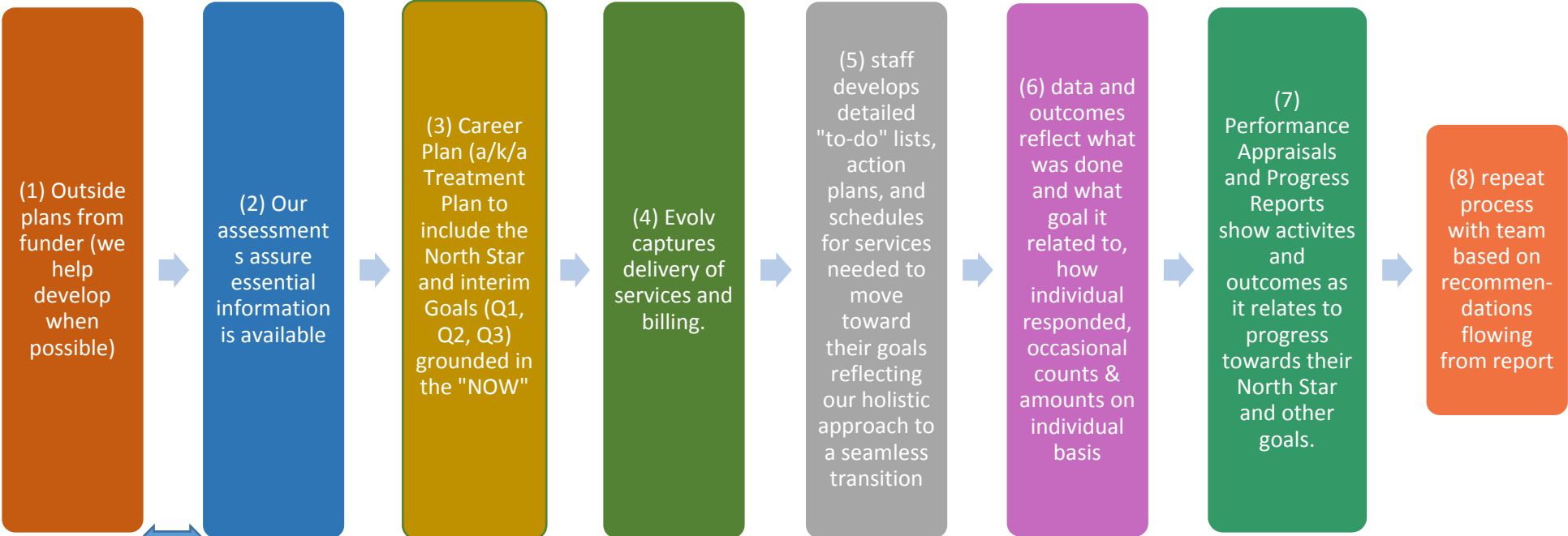


Infographic of DLW Career Training and Transition Services

Values: Employment First because leads to other valued life outcomes; ALL can work (always preferable to be paid with benefits) given customized employment and support; services grounded in trauma-informed and relationship-based PBS; MACS/presumption of competence w/recognition of neurodiversity; celebration of diversity/recognition that one size does not fit all/Individualized
